- There are thousands of different types of soil across the world? The USA alone has more than 70,000 varieties of soil.
- It takes 500 years to produce an inch of topsoil, which is the most productive layer of soil?
- About 70% of the weight of a text book or magazine is soil?
- Soil is alive? There are more microorganisms in a handful of soil than there are people on Earth.
- Almost all the antibiotics we take to help us fight infections and disease were obtained from soil microorganisms?
- Some animals, like chimpanzees in Uganda eat soil? This lets them absorb nutrients in harmful foods.
- Soil is a non-renewable natural resource? This should make us think of how much we value it.



CONTEST RULES

- ⇒ Only digital posters (photographs or scanned copies of the hand drawn posters in a JPEG format) will be accepted at the national level. Photographs must be clear and wellframed. It is the local district/state association/auxiliary/agency's decision what size and what kind of poster (hand drawn or digital) they accept for your local or state contest.
- ⇒ All posters must be created by an individual student, rather than a team of students.
- ⇒ The 2019 theme "Life in the Soil: Dig Deeper" must be included on the front side of each poster.
- ⇒ Each entry for the national contest must be submitted to NACD with an entry form to be eligible for judging. The form must be completed and signed by a parent or guardian.
- ⇒ Although younger students will most likely receive help in planning from parents or teachers, NACD encourages each student to do their own work. (Note: Entries with student handwriting and coloring will score better than those designed, drawn, and colored by adult assistance.)
- ⇒ Only official state poster contest sponsors can submit entries for the national contest. Entries must be emailed by **December 1, 2019** to stewardship@nacdnet.org.

POSTER EVALUATION

National Poster Contest entries are reviewed based on the following criteria:

- Conservation message (50 percent) (Poster uses correct theme)
- Visual effectiveness (30 percent)
- Originality (10 percent) and
- Universal appeal (10 percent)



PRIZES

Local awards and recognition will be given.

State winners will be eligible for NACD's National Poster Contest and prizes.

All poster entries should be sent to your local conservation district.
